Morphology Matters - OGCE Training in an Urban Public High School

OGCE training can be as flexible as the Approach itself. With over 50% of the incoming freshman class scoring one to five grades below level in reading comprehension, The Met knew that increasing students' reading levels was a priority. A focus on Latin and Greek derivatives is a powerful tool for teachers to support students' vocabulary development. Individuals with varying education backgrounds participated in a one-week, 30 hour "OGCE Bootcamp" which prepared them to provide instruction to groups

of students in need of support. The course outline, as well as the results of the

intervention, will be discussed.
